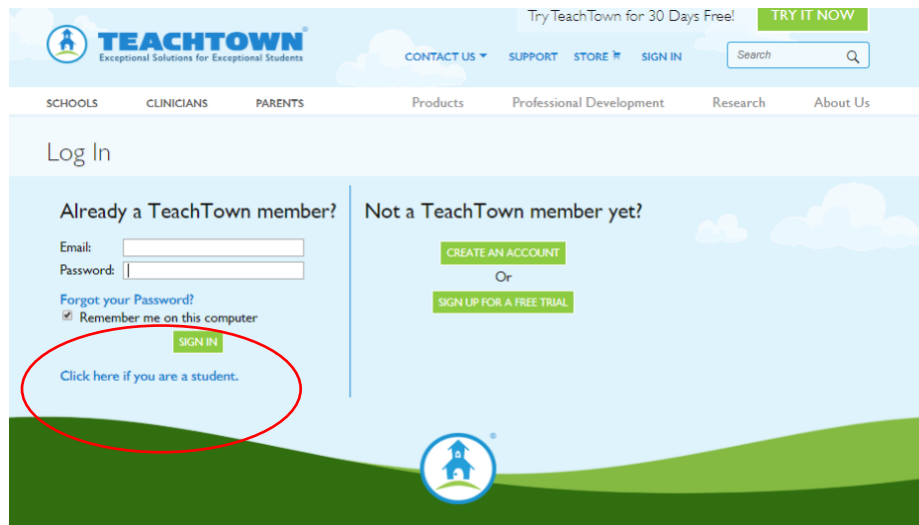

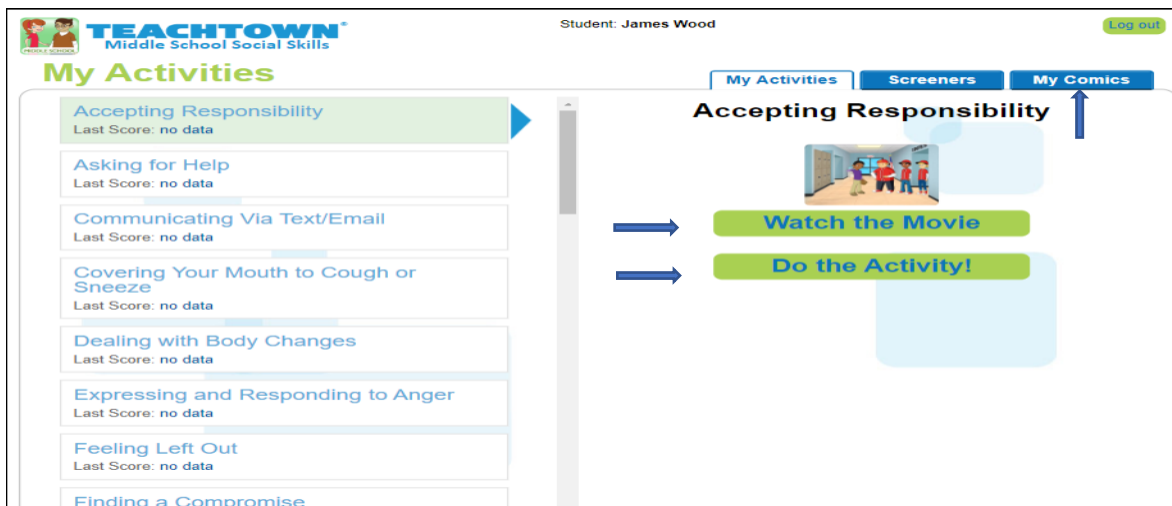
Parent/Guardian Instructions
